While animals are in our care, we constantly monitor their health and well-being; beginning with regular checks during business hours conducted according to guidelines created by experts.

In order to assure that we meet this commitment, we have and will continue to:

- consult other industry experts in regards to the handling of our animals.
- work closely with our shipping company as one of their few approved live animal shippers.
- provide extensive training for and place strict conduct standards on each and every employee working with our animals.
- maintain safe and sanitary facilities and follow through with rigorous procedures to mitigate neglect and disease.

To this end, we have consistently met, and in some cases, exceeded industry standards. Since beginning operations over six years ago, Wild Creations has never received a complaint or been found to be negligent in respect to its animal handling.

Additionally, as part of our continuous improvement philosophy, Wild Creations:

- openly volunteers our facility for inspection by local humane societies and health departments.
- engages qualified professionals and educators for feedbacks.
